

# Hello and welcome to Kindergarten!

I hope this letter finds you and your family enjoying summer and thinking about the upcoming school year. The Early Childhood Center staff and I have been working to prepare for the first day. Important information is included in the elementary student handbook; I have listed some of the highlights for you here:

## Back to School Visits

Instead of the traditional Open House, this year parents are invited to visit EC with their children during regular school hours on August 11-12 to find the classrooms, drop off supplies, tour the building and grounds, and stop by the office to check records and verify bus information. Kindergarten parent meetings will be held on August 25<sup>th</sup> and August 27<sup>th</sup>, depending upon the individual classes. More information will be provided after school begins.

## Before - After School Care

Tiger STRIPES (Students and Teachers Reaching Incredible Potential Every Session) will offer before- and after-school childcare services for students grades K-6 from 6:30-7:30am and from 3:00-6:30pm. The monthly fees are: full-time morning program \$35, 1-3 days enrollment \$30, full-time afternoon program \$130, 1-3 days enrollment is \$100. A non-refundable \$25 registration fee is required. Full-day child care is available for \$15 per day on those days when school is not in session or is cancelled due to bad weather. Arrangements may be made by calling Tiger STRIPES (735-3778).

## Daily Schedule

School begins promptly at 8:00am. Students should arrive at school no earlier than 7:40am and no later than 8:00am. School dismisses at 3:25pm. For the safety of the children, students will not be called from the classroom after 2:45 pm. Any student remaining at school after dismissal will be sent to Tiger STRIPES and an automatic \$10 drop-in fee will be charged.

## Late-start Mondays

**We will begin school at 8:30am every Monday morning, beginning August 24<sup>th</sup>.** This time allows teachers to collaborate regarding students' academic needs and improvement of instruction. Such a highly effective, professional development practice has been proven to result in improved student achievement. The school busses will still have the same routes on Mondays, but will run approximately 30 minutes later than normal. Please note that school will still dismiss at the regular time on Mondays, with no changes to how or when busses run in the afternoon.



## Lunch Debt Management

Parents are encouraged to pay for students' meals at least a week in advance. If a student accumulates charges totaling \$20, elementary students will be served a peanut butter and jelly sandwich and milk until the debt is reduced. Additionally, kindergarten students will no longer be able to charge afternoon juice. Questions about Food Services should be directed to Ruth Melvin at 732-3650 x 5114.
