

The following Republic High School AP (Advanced Placement) courses come with the option to enroll, pay and take the AP examinations in May, 2023. AP exams will be held at RHS and participating students will be excused from classes during that time. Students who score high enough on the various AP exams will earn college credit. **Taking the AP test is completely voluntary and does not affect the course experience in any manner.**

REGISTRATION & DEPOSIT DEADLINE: November 11, 2022

TEST FEE: \$97 PER EXAM

\$62 PER EXAM FOR STUDENTS WITH FREE/REDUCED LUNCH

DEPOSIT FEE: \$40 PER EXAM DUE BY November 11, 2022

BALANCE: Due by Friday, April 7, 2023

The cost of the test for each course is \$97. Students who qualify for free/reduced lunch will be charged \$62 per exam. Students wishing to take any AP exam will need to pay the \$40 non-refundable deposit, per exam, no later than Friday, November 11, 2022. The remaining balance for the tests will be due no later than Friday, April 7, 2023.

You may pay the deposit or the whole amount. Also, please be advised there is a small “convenience fee” for using the online ordering system. Your Login for RevTrack is the same as your SIS username and password. If you are taking more than one AP exam, you will need to go through the checkout/payment process twice.

Please be advised that AP American Government, AP Biology and AP Calculus are also offered as dual credit courses. Students who prefer to enroll in dual credit for those courses will do so in January, so no action needs to be taken at this time.

AP vs. DUAL CREDIT

Determining which option to go with is a personal decision for each student and family.

AP: The upside is that AP tests are less expensive than dual credit fees, and the student has the entire school year to prepare for the exam. The downside is that if a student doesn't score well enough on the exam, no college credit will be awarded.

Dual Credit: Students may earn college credit if they pass a dual credit class with a grade of C or better, though it is highly encouraged that a student only enroll in a dual credit course if an A or B is likely to be obtained. Also, eligibility requirements state that a student must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 to be automatically eligible to enroll for college credit. [RHS Dual Credit Courses](#)

Though most colleges and universities *typically* accept both AP and dual credit earned in high school as general education requirements, there are no guarantees that a student's desired college will do so, particularly if a student plans on going out of state. When in doubt, it is always best to consult the college of choice for guidance on course credit transfer policies. [How Dual Credit Transfers](#)
